2020 Community Engaged Scholarship Award

This award seeks to recognize a KU faculty member whose scholarship actively collaborates with a community partner through the creation of and dissemination of knowledge or creative expression while contributing to the scholar's discipline and strengthening the wellbeing of the community. The award amount is \$1,000.

Eligibility:

Faculty at any rank and academic staff in the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences are eligible for this award.

Criteria:

Nominations will be evaluated on the following:

- Impact of teaching and learning, service, or research in the community
- Demonstration of reciprocity and mutuality in community-based partnerships; and
- Evidence of scholarly contributions in the faculty member's field or the literature of community-based scholarship.

Nomination Materials:

- Letter of nomination and or statement from nominee describing the nature and scope of the work, its novelty/impact on the discipline and benefits the population being served (3 pages maximum, please).
- Evidence of a strong community partnership (e.g. letters of support from the community).
- Documentation of scholarly outcomes (publications, exhibits, best practice papers, etc.).
- Supplemental evidence documenting a positive impact of the research on the community.
