It requires coursework on the basic principles of behavioral science and its research methods but emphasizes course work and training in applic (e.g., assessment, analysis, intervention, evaluation). Its objective is to advance empirically based solutions to problems of individual and societal importa both local and global.

| Additional Information | This proposal for a new graduate certificate is intended to facilitate enrollment and tracking of students pursuing a sequence of courses to prepare them for an external certification exam. To date students pursuing this sequence have enrolled as non-degree seeking. The On-Behavior Analysis Graduate Program in the Department of Applied Behavioral Science started its first cohort in the fall of 2016. Eight students have been admitted and two others are currently in the process of applying. Students are located in Kansas, Missouri, Ohio, Connecticut, and Colorado. The six online courses have been submitted to the Behavior Analytic Certification Board for formal approval as educational preparation for the international examination to become a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst. The courses are 100% online and involve both asynchronous and synchronous activities, including a weekly meeting among the faculty and students via the virtual classroom at the course website. |
